

Master's degree in Intervention in Cases of Violence against Women

Admission criteria

This Master's is open to any qualified person, without discrimination with regard to age, sex, race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, origin or any other condition.

Apart from the entry requirements established in the current legislation and the candidate profile outlined in the previous section, a positive assessment will be necessary to enter the Master's degree programme.

This assessment will take into account the following criteria:

- Academic transcript
- Undergraduate studies related to the Master's degree field
- Prior postgraduate or continuing education courses related to the Master's degree programme, previous professional experience, knowledge of other languages, particularly English
- Motivation to undertake the programme, professional aims, attitudes and values related to the professional career concerned, capacity for teamwork and personal maturity.
