

## Graduate Profile: BA in Modern Languages: Specialisms in English Studies, Hispanic Studies, Linguistics Studies, Literary Studies.

This degree trains professionals in languages and cultures for the 21<sup>st</sup> century. It will provide graduates with a comprehensive training in four languages and prepare them to work in several career areas.

At the end of their degree, students will have acquired the language skills and competences described in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, with C1 and C2 levels of competence in several aspects of the CEFR for three languages (English, Basque and Spanish). In addition, graduates in Modern Languages will acquire an A2-B1 level in either German, French, Chinese or Arabic.

Graduates will achieve an advanced level in ICT use in the language field, with a focus on the implementation of language studies in fields such as translation, language management, intercultural communication and mediation and language teaching.

Graduates who choose the international programme and the external internships on the BA degree will acquire different and complementary perspectives; they will gain an insight into the international dimension of the degree and broaden their personal and academic curriculum in any of the specialisms of the degree.

Graduates' choice of one or more Specialisms of the BA in Modern Languages will train them in the language and culture of language-speaking countries (English studies), English and Spanish language, and their mechanisms (Linguistic Studies), English and Spanish literature (Literary Studies) and language and culture of the Hispanic world (Hispanic Studies).

At the end of their degree, graduates will have acquired a high level in conceptual and practical aspects of language use. Once they have completed this degree and its various specialisms, graduates will have been trained in various subject areas that will allow them to face a future in which languages, their cultures and skills to be used in the different international academic and career contexts are essential.

Specifically, this degree allows graduates to work in:

- **Internationalisation:** Translation, language experts, multinational companies.
- **Training:** Language teaching and research.
- Communication and publishing: Media, publishing houses, language consultancy.
- **New technologies:** Online documentation, computerised libraries, online language resources, computational linguistics, computer-assisted language teaching.
- Cultural leisure: Cultural experts and cultural entertainers.
