

Recommended admission profile - Bachelor's Degree in International Relations

This degree is especially aimed at those who have a particular sensitivity to issues of the global order and who wish to develop their professional activity in intergovernmental organisations and the foreign service of States, international non-governmental organisations, multinational corporations, national and international media, teaching and research, etc., managing and leading processes, projects and strategies of negotiation, mediation, etc. related to the international positioning of different actors in the system.

It is, therefore, a degree aimed at students who are interested in knowing and analysing, with a critical and reflective spirit, not only the world around them but also the new global frameworks that are increasingly complex, intercultural and interdependent.

The degree is taught in Spanish and English interchangeably, without this implying that subjects are offered separately in Spanish and in English. Therefore, a C1 level of English is required, and knowledge of another international language is desirable, although not decisive.

Graduate profile of the Bachelor's Degree in International Relations

The Bachelor's Degree in International Relations aims to train graduates capable of analysing and understanding the complexity of the system of international relations, its origin, evolution and current situation, the actors, relationships and conflicts generated within it, as well as the theoretical approaches that interpret it. Through the different subjects that make up the curriculum, graduates will have addressed current international affairs from political, economic, social and legal perspectives, as well as the functioning of international organisations such as the European Union or the UN.

Graduates will have acquired the conceptual, methodological and competence-based tools specific to the discipline of international relations, which will enable them to continue their postgraduate training in specific areas of this discipline and to perform professionally in various fields of international organisations, as well as in any company or institution that carries out its activity in international contexts often characterised by political, linguistic and cultural complexity. Likewise, graduates will have developed an ethical attitude of respect for and promotion of fundamental rights, as well as the values of equality, solidarity, cooperation and peace as drivers of international relations.

Graduates will be qualified to carry out a wide range of tasks in:

- The public sector: the foreign service of States at its different levels (diplomatic and consular missions, external projection bodies of state, regional and local administrations, cultural managers abroad, etc.); regional intergovernmental organisations (European Union, Council of Europe, NATO, etc.); global intergovernmental organisations (UN, WB, IMF, WTO, etc.); State information and

intelligence services.

- In the private sector: the area of international business (companies, chambers of commerce); social organisations, etc.); non-governmental organisations: international cooperation and advisory services (international NGOs, international cooperation agents, international policy/economics consultancy and advisory firms, etc.); international information and communication (international press; communication departments in non-governmental organisations and transnational companies); teaching and research.

All students must demonstrate a C1 level of English in both the degree and the double degree, and a B1 level in a second language.
